Advocacy and Promotion

1. To promote the sustainable harvest of CRA 7 rock lobster.
2. To encourage promote and generally advance the businesses of the participants in the NZ rock lobster industry, particularly those operating within the CRA 7 boundaries.
3. To liaise and consult where appropriate with all relevant organisations and agencies to attain these objectives.
4. To be involved in any legislative decision-making processes, particularly those relating to the maintenance of property rights, harvest rights and access to productive fishing areas.
5. To be involved in the development and implementation of government policies particularly those relating to marine protected areas and the allocation of resources in shared fisheries. Promote a marine user's proposal for ministerial consideration.

6. To contribute to the development of appropriate standards and specifications in relation to the CRA7 fishery, including the design of research and management strategies, and the development and implementation of industry agreed harvest initiatives in consultation with other user groups.
7. To contribute to the maintenance and improvement of product Quality Standards for NZ rock lobster.
8. To contribute to the collection of data that will inform and enhance the credibility of stock assessment methods.
10. To monitor the operation of the CRA7 Management Procedure.
11. To continue to support and contribute to NZ RLIC initiatives and attendance at meetings.
